What's Threatening Trestles?



What and Where is Trestles?

Trestles is a collection of surfing spots at San Onofre State Beach in San Diego County, California. Trestles consists of, from north to south, Upper Trestles (Uppers), Lower Trestles (Lowers), and Middle Trestles (Middles). North of Upper Trestles is the surf spot called Cottons. South of Middles is the surf spot called The Church.

What is Threatening Trestles?

For more than 15 years, California's Transportation Corridor Agency has been trying to build a toll road that would run through and devastate one of the most visited and beloved state parks in California - San Onofre State Beach. The toll road would have destroyed thousands of acres of open space that contain endangered species, polluted the watershed, and ultimately, destroyed the waves of the world-renowned surf spot, Trestles.

What is the Status of the Toll Road Project?

On November 10, 2016, the Surfrider Foundation, a member of the Save San Onofre Coalition, reached a settlement with toll road developers that guarantees millions of Californians will be able to enjoy this magnificent park, its beaches and natural areas for years to come.
